Flexible Grouping in the Differentiated Classroom Occurs when there is a whole group assessment or instruction initially; and then the students are divided by their need for review, re-teaching, practice, or enrichment. Such grouping could be a single lesson or objective, a set of skills, a unit of study, or a major concept or theme.
